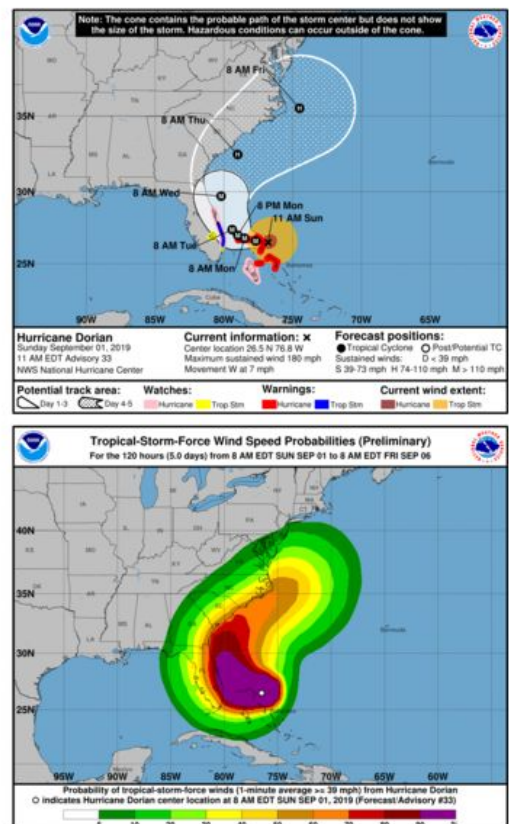
Hurricane Dorian Update 1



Key Messages for Hurricane Dorian Advisory 33: 11:00 AM EDT Sun Sep 01, 2019



1. A prolonged period of catastrophic winds and storm surge will affect the Abaco Islands today. Everyone there should take immediate shelter and not venture into the eye. These catastrophic conditions are likely on Grand Bahama Island later today or tonight, and efforts to protect life and property there should be rushed to completion.
2. Storm surge and hurricane watches and tropical storm warnings are in effect for portions of the Florida east coast. Life-threatening storm surge and dangerous hurricane-force winds are possible along portions of the Florida east coast through mid-week, as only a slight deviation to the left of the official forecast would bring the core of Dorian near or over the coast. Residents should listen to advice given by local emergency officials.
3. There is an increasing likelihood of strong winds and dangerous storm surge along the coasts of Georgia, South Carolina, and North Carolina later this week. Residents in these areas should continue to monitor the progress of Dorian.
4. Heavy rains, capable of producing life-threatening flash floods, are possible over northern portions of the Bahamas and coastal sections of the southeast and lower mid-Atlantic regions of the United States through late this week.

Latest Port Updates:

USCG Sector Miami

Port Condition **YANKEE** was set effective 1200/31 and remains as of this message for Miami, Miami River, Port Everglades, Port of Palm Beach and Ft Pierce. No vessels are permitted to enter port w/out specific permission from USCG.

USCG Sector Jacksonville

Port Condition **YANKEE** was set effective 1700/31 and remains for Port Canaveral only. No vessel are permitted to enter port unless specific permission granted by USCG.

Port Condition **X-RAY** was set effective 2000/29 and remains for Jacksonville and Fernandina Beach. Port Condition **YANKEE** will not be set as previously expected due to current shift of storm path to the east. However, Sector JAX will reassess conditions on Sunday, 1400hrs and will release a decision by 1700hrs if any further port condition settings are necessary. We'll keep all updated accordingly.

USCG Sector Savannah

Port Condition **X-RAY** was set effective 0800/31 for Brunswick, Savannah.

USCG Sector Charleston

Port Condition **X-RAY** was set effective 0000/01-Sep. Next USCG discussion is scheduled for 1015 this morning. An interim report may be provided if next level condition is set or scheduled for Sector CHS.

USCG Sector North Carolina

Port condition **WHISKEY** will be set effective Sunday, 1200/01-Sep for Wilmington (NC), Morehead City and Sunny Point. Next USCG discussion is scheduled for 1300hrs today. An interim report may be provided if next level condition is set or scheduled for Sector NC.

USCG Sector St Petersburg

Port Condition **X-RAY** was set effective 2000/30 and remains for Tampa, St Petersburg and Port Manatee. No further condition settings are expected as of this message and per current/forecasted storm path.

Port Condition Guide:

Whiskey: Set when gale force winds are expected to arrive at the port within 72 hours. Port remains open to all commercial traffic, but oceangoing ships and barges must report their intention to remain in port or depart. If they are departing, they must do so within 12 hours of gale-force winds.

X-Ray: Gale force winds are expected within 48 hours. The rules are similar to port condition Whiskey.

Yankee: Gale force winds predicted within 24 hours. Vessels seeking to depart must arrange immediate departure. Cargo operations must cease with 18 kilometre per hour (kph) winds. Transfer hoses must be disconnected with 22 kph winds. Ships seeking to arrive in port should seek an alternate destination.

Zulu: Gale force winds within 12 hours. The port is closed.
